FIRST READING Amos 6.1a, 4-7

A reading from the book of the prophet Amos.

Thus says the LORD, the God of hosts: Alas for those who are at ease in Zion, and for those who feel secure on Mount Samaria!

Alas for those who lie on beds of ivory, and lounge on their couches, and eat lambs from the flock, and calves from the stall; who sing idle songs to the sound of the harp, and like David improvise on instruments of music; who drink wine from bowls, and anoint themselves with the finest oils, but are not grieved over the ruin of Joseph! Therefore they shall now be the first to go into exile, and the revelry of the loungers shall pass away.

This is the Word of the Lord. **All Thanks be to God.**

SECOND READING 1 Timothy 6.6-19

A reading from the first letter of Paul to Timothy.

There is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a

root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honour and eternal dominion. Amen.

As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

GOSPEL READING Luke 16.19-end

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according Luke. **All Glory to you, O Lord.**

Jesus told this parable to those among the Pharisees who loved money: 'There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his

hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames." But Abraham said, "Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us." He said, "Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house—for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment." Abraham replied, "They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them." He said, "No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent." He said to him, "If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **All Praise to you, O Christ.**



Home, Hospitality, and Hope The Church as Host for the World

8th October 2025 (Wednesday) 7.30-9.00pm Li Hall, St John's Cathedral



Our Speaker:

The Very Revd Professor Martyn Percy

Hong Kong has a population of 7.5 million and attracts almost 50 million visitors a year. At the heart of Hong Kong Island is St John's Cathedral—probably one of the most important and iconic Anglican Cathedrals in the world, standing at the centre of a major hub for business, finance, and tourism.

But what is the role of a cathedral in a major city of this kind? What kinds of values shape the identity, mission, and ministry of a cathedral in the world today? Our Provost Theologian, the Very Revd Professor Martyn Percy, helps us explore these questions for St John's Cathedral, our churches and congregations across the HKSKH Province, and the wider international Anglican Communion.

This lecture will examine how the church initially understood itself as a hospitable home and a sign of hope in the ancient world. Drawing on a rich tapestry of scripture, art, literature, history, and culture, this lecture dwells on how our vision of God shaped the nature, purpose, and understanding of the church in the past—and now the present. Even more importantly, what does this mean for the wider world? As a Cathedral today, what kind of home, hospitality, and hope does God offer today?
