

FAQs:

Who can join Faith Begins?

Any adult who has been regularly worshipping at St John's Cathedral or the daughter churches for at least 6 months, and who wants to be baptized and confirmed. Baptism and Confirmation are public statements of commitment to the Christian faith and to the Church.

I cannot attend church services regularly. Can I be baptized and confirmed?

St John's Cathedral has 3 services on Saturday, 6 services on Sunday, and at least one service every weekday. Regular worship in church is expected as part of a Christian life.

Can my child accompany me?

Please do not bring your child. The course is designed for adults not children. If you want your child baptized, please talk to us.

What if I can't join every week?

We hope and expect that you will join every session of 'Faith Begins'. If you have to miss a session for unavoidable reasons, please let us know in advance.

I don't understand what is baptism and confirmation. Can I still join the course?

If you want to become a member of the Church but you are not sure if this is the right course for you, please contact us.

Joining 'Faith Begins' is not only attending a course, it's also belonging to a church and becoming part of a worshipping community. We look forward to seeing you in church.

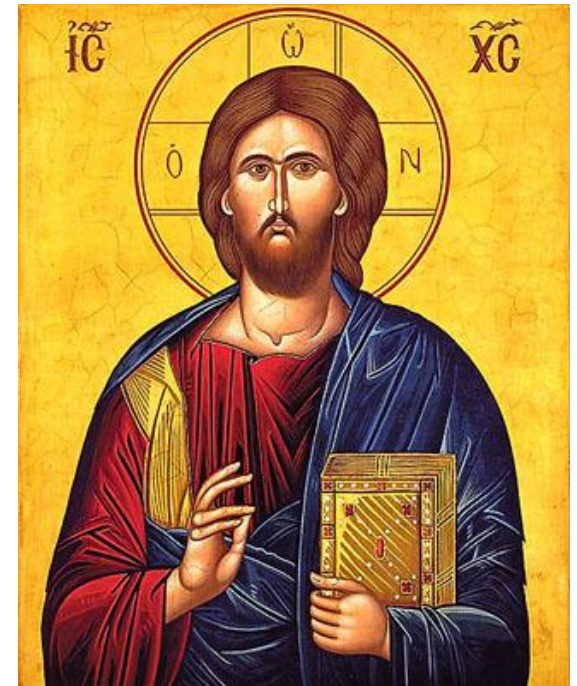

What is Faith Begins?

The 'Faith Begins' Course at St John's Cathedral is an introduction to Christianity, leading to baptism and confirmation for adults who are regularly worshipping with us, who want to make a commitment to follow Jesus Christ, and become members of St John's Cathedral and the daughter churches, the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui (HKSKH), and the Anglican Church worldwide.

'Faith Begins' is rooted in the Anglican tradition which values the bible, tradition, and reason, and interprets them in the light of a modern understanding about life and the world we live in.

We examine the essentials of Christian teaching, and explore some of the questions of faith, which are often the big questions of life:

What gives meaning to our life?
Why does God allow evil and suffering?
How can I live my life better?
What happens when we die?

Christianity gives insights into God and life's questions. In particular, how the life of Jesus of Nazareth might help us to live our lives now. We don't give easy answers, but we do promise honest exploring.

Talks are given in English or Chinese, with simultaneous interpretation. Group discussions are in English, Cantonese or Putonghua.
